The 1976 West of England Grading List comprises 1848 names, 444 of which are from Hampshire. Next year, only the names of players who are registered with the B.C.F. will appear - a decision by the Union Council which is raising a good deal of controversy.

I declare myself fully in agreement with this ruling. The preparation of these statistics involves a great deal of work at County and Union level, bearing in mind that results have to be accumulated for everyone, whether or not their grades are published. Why then should a player who contributes nothing to County or Union finances have the benefit of all this work?

So strongly do I feel on this issue, I am anticipating next year's decision by publishing only those names of players in the Portsmouth area (including Isle of Wight) who are currently registered. Hereunder the first list containing those whose names begin with the letters A to G. (Previous year's grading number in brackets):

CHESS NOTES

13th September, 1976

It seems probable that we shall see 23 teams lined up for the coming season's play in the Portsmouth & District League (20 last season). New teams are entered from Emsworth, I.B.M. 'B', Leigh Park 'B' and Polytechnic 'C', but Portsmouth may be dropping their 'B' team from Division 1.

The League's A.G.M. is due to be held on Wednesday, 29th September, at Southsea Youth and Community Centre, at which a number of alterations to the rules will be proposed. One that is of particular interest is yet another attempt to reduce the number of adjudications. As things now stand, the two players concerned can continue the unfinished game at a later date if they both agree to do so. The new proposal is that the game shall be continued at a second session if either player wishes. Unfortunately, few players relish turning out to the opponent's venue on a winter's night for what may be quite a short session, but if this fact alone encourages some of them to agree a result which would otherwise have gone to the adjudicator, the new rule will have achieved something.

A couple of seasons ago, with the same objective in mind, it was suggested that unfinished games be completed on the 'sudden death' principle, but this proposal failed on the grounds that the result of such games would not count for grading. I now see that the B.C.F. Grading Committee has relented and an extract from their latest report says "tournaments in which games are finished at fast time limits may be graded provided certain minimum conditions are met". Perhaps this way round the vexed question of adjudication is still open.

I derived much enjoyment in reading Bill Harston's amusing new book "How to Cheat at Chess" (£1.95) and published by Hutchinsons, which in any case makes a pleasant change from the steady flow of more serious publications on opening theory and middle game practice. The chapter on "How to be a Chess Journalist" was of particular interest to me as, amongst other things, this contains annotation notes after every move of a 12 move game every one of which the author swears has appeared in a chess journal during the past few years and every one of which could be used again in any other game for practically any move! (Examples: "bther lines cause the defence little difficulty" and "the purpose of Black's opening dispositions is now clear"). I shall no doubt be drawing heavily on this material in future!

The diagram published this week demonstrates a simple sacrificial mating combination: 1. R-R8+, KxR; 2. R-R1+, K-N1; 3. R-R8+, KxR; 4. Q-R1+ and mate next move on R7. (But would you or I have seen it under match conditions, particularly as we would have been much concerned with Black's mate on the move?)

CHESS NOTES

20th September, 1976

The 26 names set out below show the Gradings of those registered local players whose names begin N-S. This controversial issue has now, I hope, been finally resolved, as the Executive Committee of the W.E.C.U. decided (in response to an appeal from the Hampshire Executive) to modify their previous ruling (that is, to publish the names but not the grading numbers of unregistered players in future Grading Lists) and to allow the gradings of unregistered Junior players to appear but for the first time only. The idea is to let Junior Organisers at least know of up-and-coming Juniors' existence; if the Junior concerned wishes to see both his name and grading number in the next list, he must be registered through his County.

One other doubt has been removed; the W.E.C.U. are to stick to their previous ruling that all games in all tournaments which allow 'sudden-death' endings will be excluded from the grading routine.

- (a) There is no entry fee, but each player wishing to take part is asked to obtain sponsors.
- (b) Each sponsor will undertake to pay anything upward from ½p for every move that the player that he is sponsoring makes against Leonard Barden, up to a maximum of 30 moves.
- (c) The money raised in this way (which could, given an enthusiastic response, be a sizeable sum) will be donated to the Hampshire Chess Association, with particular emphasis on the furtherance of Junior activities.
- (d) If a player obtains 10 or more sponsors, his Club will receive a refund of the amount of his County registration fee.

All this seems to me to add up to an ingenious and praiseworthy effort to publicise the game locally and, at the same time, help the County, which is hard-pressed financially this year.
