From the diagrammed position Black plays 59...P-N4; 60. BPxP (if 60. RPxP P-R5; 61. B-Q6 B-B4; 62. P-N6 BxP; 63. P-B5 BxP; 64. KxP K-N7 and White is forced to give up his Bishop for the RP) 60...P-Q5+; 61. Pxp K-N6; 62. B-R3 KxP; 63. K-Q3 KxP; 64. K-K4 P-R5; 65. K-B3 B-Q4+ and White resigned.

"Rule 14 (b) (ii) : Except for a club whose first team plays in Division 3, no player whose grade is 160 or more shall play in a lower Division than Division 2"

From the position shown, White forces a win by some very clever pawn play (Smyslov v. Penrose, Amsterdam 1954).

3. K-B8 B-B4+ (if 3...P-K8 = Q; 4. Q-Q2+ QxQ stalemate) 4. K-Q8 P-K8 = Q;

(9...B-K3 is the only possible correct move); 10. N-B6 dbl.+k-Q1 (Even at this stage I was so upset at the thought of losing my Q, I quite overlooked the mate next move) 11. R-K8 mate.

Last week, I recorded my surprise at discovering that I first played Roy Carter, of Community Centre, over 25 years ago. The position shown arose from the game between A.F. Langley (who had the White pieces) and myself in the match Cosham B v. Fareham on 11th March 1952. It is interesting that we are still playing for the same Clubs after all this time.

From the position reached, I played 28...R(B1)-B6?, giving myself the question mark and a note "the obvious move is 28...NxP!". After 28 years, I can only think that I overlooked the fact that my QR was en prise, so the agreed draw that resulted after the following 6 more moves was probably fair -

This was all before grading was thought of, so whether or not we are better players now is open to question. What is certain is that it is well worth keeping (and indexing) all one's games.

The question is, therefore, has Black a better move than the one he now plays ?

I find this a most interesting position and ask the question - could White have done better? I would have thought that if he could capture both Black's isolated and advanced pawns, he was in with a chance of a draw (which would give Fareham a win on Board count).

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The W.E.C.U. English Counties Championship was won by Devon after one of the most exciting end-of-season struggles seen for some years. Price of Newport, I.O.W., but a Match Captain has still to be found quickly if Hampshire is to take part in County matches this coming season. Any volunteers to me, please.

The diagrammed position arose in a friendly game when Capablanca had the White piece. It went 1. Q - N5! and Black resigns, because he saw that if 1..... Q x Q; 2. R - N7 + K - R1; 3. R x KRP + K - N1; 4. R (N7) - N7 mate.

Capablanca pointed out later that Black could have defended himself by 1..... R - K8 +; 2. K - B2 R - KR8!
