The Hampshire Chess Association.

I wish first of all to make it quite clear that this is not a history of the association. It consists solely as a collection of facts and records which have been collected from the sources available, and are placed here under various headings.

During the winter of 1943/4 I was serving in the Royal Air Force, and it appeared likely that I should have a certain amount of free time on my hands. I thought that I would write some sort of history of the association's activities, and accordingly brought with me all the references that were available. On looking through them it appeared evident that the records were not complete, and I decided to endeavour to pick out and classify all the facts, with the intention of trying, at some future time, to fill in the blanks. Some of these can, and will be, filled, but others will be impossible to find.

The only time that any form of history of the association has been written was in 1929, in the first edition of the Southern Counties Year Book when about four pages were devoted to it. It had been considered likely that at the association's Jubilee in 1940 a more complete history would have been written and published either as part of that same volume or separately. I had considered starting it now that the main facts are completed, but it had better be left until it is known in what form it is required and in what manner it will be published.

Apart from the collecting of facts this work has brought to my notice a number of facts that should help in the future development of the association. Naturally they are not recorded here, but will be brought to the notice of the President for consideration on the resumption of activities at the end of the war.

Finally, there are two "Sections" untouched. The first "Chess in Schools", because this will involve getting details from sources that are inconvenient at present. Secondly, in due course I hope to obtain a record

on similar lines to this, from each of the clubs
affiliated to the Association, and to incorporate it
with this present volume.

Honorary Life Vice-Presidents of the Hampshire Chess Association.

At the Association's forty-fifth Annual general meeting, held on October 6th 1934 Mr A. B. Goe was elected an Honorary Life Vice-President of the Association in appreciation of his valued services as Honorary Secretary and Treasurer over a period of eleven years. This came into being this class of Vice-Presidents, who, according to precedent have been granted the same privileges and executive powers of normally elected and subscribing officers of that class.

At the same meeting Mr J. H. Blake was elected as a mark of appreciation of his services as a founder, President, Vice-President and Match Captain of the Association.

At the forty-seventh Annual general meeting held on October 3rd 1936 Mr B. G. Chapman was elected on his leaving the County and resigning the Presidency.

The Committee or Council.

In the printed reports for the years 1894-1910 are lists of names of the Committee, but the minutes of meetings show no evidence of elections, neither is there any record of any rules governing the existence of a committee. It is therefore uncertain who acted on the committee in addition to the President, Match Captain, and Honorary Secretary. (It is apparent that the match captain did, as Mr Blake's name does not appear elsewhere.)

It appears however that by rule and precedent that up ~~to~~ to 1910 each club nominated two delegates by name to act for a year. These names are recorded. Subsequently clubs sent two delegates to a meeting, and this explains the lack of names of the Committee from 1911 to 1928.

During this time several "Sub-Committees" were formed and recorded as having been elected by the Annual General Meeting. There is no minute book preserved prior to 1928 so how often the Committee met or what business they transacted is unknown. That they did meet and transact business is evident from lack of continuity in the minutes of the Annual General Meetings. These references ceased shortly before the Great War and it appears to have been a non-contentious period when things were going smoothly and everything was left to the Annual Meeting and the Secretary.

From 1920 onwards it is known that no committee met for some years, and the next reference is in the minutes for the Annual meeting held on October 9th 1926 when the Association's rules were revised and an "Advisory Council" was to be formed. This Council did not meet for two years, and at the 1928 Annual Meeting it was made an "Executive Council" of nine elected members in addition to the Officers of the Association (excluding Vice-Presidents), and was to meet as often as necessary, but not less than half-yearly.

The Council has functioned regularly since that time.

The Hampshire Chess Association

Constitution and General Rules.

The first reference in the Association's records to any rules is found in the minutes of the 1898 Annual General Meeting when an amendment to rule 3 was made. The amendment was inserted in the minute book in the form of a cutting from printed rules, so presumably the rules were circulated or re-circulated at that time.

Presumably the General Rules were well known and accepted as no further reference to them can be found until 1924, when a further amendment was made to the same rule: - regarding subscriptions.

In 1925 the rules were re-drafted by an unspecified sub-committee, and were duly published, but here again no copy can be found. It appears however that those rules remained unaltered until published in the first edition of the year book in 1930, and they have remained the same since.

The only controversial point is with regard to the voting power at the Annual or Special General Meetings. The rules define membership of the Association, and for many years all members present have been given a vote. But at the period 1923/4 this was not so, and only a certain number of "delegates" from each club voted, although others were present and spoke. On my attending my first meeting in 1924 it was impressed on me that I had no vote!

It must be noted that the rules for the various competitions are framed separately, and are recorded in their appropriate sections.

Hampshire Chess Association. General Rules 1940.

1. The Association shall be entitled "The Hampshire Chess Association", and its objects shall be to encourage the establishment of clubs throughout the County, and to foster and encourage chess generally.
2. The Association shall consist of a President, Vice-Presidents, Members of Affiliated Clubs and Unattached Members. The Officers of the Association shall be a Chairman, Match Captain, and an Honorary Secretary.

and Treasurer.

3. The Annual Affiliation fee for Clubs shall be:- 7/6 for 15 members, 12/6 for from 15 to 21 members and 15/- for over 21 members. The subscription from members of such clubs shall be 1/- [to be collected by the clubs and forwarded with the club fee]. The subscription for unattached members shall be not less than 2/6, and for Vice-Presidents not less than 10/6.

All Club affiliation fees should be paid by May in each year.

4. The management of the association shall be carried on by a Council consisting of the Officers of the Association, together with nine members elected at the Annual General Meeting in each year. The Council shall meet as often as summoned by the honorary secretary, which shall not be less than once in each year.

5. An Annual General Meeting shall be held on the first Saturday in October each year, for the purpose of electing the Officers and Council, and for other business arising. At this meeting a report of the past year and a statement of accounts shall be submitted by the honorary secretary and treasurer. Members wishing to submit motions for this meeting must send notice of them to the honorary secretary not later than September 15th.

A Special General Meeting may be called either by the Council or upon requisition to the honorary secretary signed by twenty members. Fourteen days notice of the meeting and its objects shall be sent to each member.

6. The Laws of Chess, as published by the British Chess Federation, shall govern all play conducted by the Association.

7. Alteration to these rules may only be made at a General Meeting of the Association.

Finances.

The financial records of the Association are unfortunately not complete, from 1894 to 1915 the annual summary was regularly recorded in the minute book, but from then until 1934 the only records are on Annual reports, some of which have not been reserved.

Despite this continuity the Annual Statements are very interesting as being a mark of the Associations progress. In the early days the recorded "turnover" amounted to £5 or £6 per annum, which increased only by £1 or so up to 1914 - during this period the activities remained constant with the League and Bounty matches as the sole activities. It is noteworthy that during this period club affiliation fees were the main source of income.

After the £ 194/1918 war activities were extended and the recorded "turnover" increased from £9 in 1920 to £108 in 1938. Club affiliation fees have tripled, but the main increase was in individual subscriptions from Presidents, Vice-Presidents and members. Annual commitments increased considerably, the large membership and extra activities made secretarial expenses much larger, Prizes for competitions had to be provided annually and the circulation of reports and year books took a considerable sum.

During all this time the funds available have just kept pace with requirements, and although there has rarely been a substantial balance to carry forward, the Association has been able to plan sufficiently far ahead without having to anticipate financial embarrassment.

Throughout its history the Association has presented its accounts as an annual statement, presented in this form they are not true annual accounts, as many receipts and payments appertain to other years, in later years an effort was made to rectify this without altering the form of the accounts, in so far as expenses were concerned - with receipts it was not done as all receipts are non-contractual.

No balance sheet has ever been presented as the property of the Association has been small, four trophies,

a typewriter and stationery being its sole possessions.

Spaces have been left in the hopes that some of the missing years can be found, although it now appears unlikely.

Southern Counties Chess Union.

It is not intended to give a complete history of the S.C.C.U., only to give sufficient data to show, for purposes of comparison, the functions of the Union of which the Hampshire Chess Association has always been a member.

The Southern Counties Chess Union was formed on Sept. 3rd 1892 at a meeting of delegates from Hampshire, Sussex, Surrey, Kent, Wiltshire, Norfolk and several London clubs. The Hampshire delegates were Messrs J.H. Blake, W.C. Kenney, and H.D. Osborn. Later, after the formation of the British Chess Federation and of the Northern and Midland Unions it was agreed that the S.C.C.U. should comprise of any or all of the following units:-
Bedfordshire, Berkshire, Buckinghamshire, Cambridge, Cornwall, Devonshire, Dorset, Essex, Gloucester, Hampshire, Hertfordshire, Huntingdonshire, Kent, Middlesex, Monmouth, Norfolk, Northampton, Somerset, Suffolk, Surrey, Sussex, Wiltshire and from any clubs within these counties that the Union shall admit.

Probably the main function of the Union is the organising of the various inter-county competitions. These are only normal over the board matches, except, in a few cases where such matches are played by telephone. By reason of its geographical situation the Union naturally divides into two sections, the Metropolitan section, consisting of Counties around London, who can conveniently play matches with each other, and for whom large sized teams are often desirable, and the other counties who, in view of travelling difficulties, can only play smaller teams and fewer matches.

Each competition is listed below, with its main conditions, and the list of winners to date.

Southern Counties Championship. (Shannon Trophy).

Teams for this competition are 16 a-side, and the competition is now run in two sections, the Metropolitan section where the various counties play each other, and the Provincial section, where the remaining counties play a knockout competition. The winners of these two sections meet in the "Final" to decide the championship. The "draw" for the Provincial section is arranged to facilitate travelling, although as much variety as possible is introduced.

Bournemouth Weekend Congress.

In the early autumn of 1937 Mr R. H. S. Stevenson, who was at that time Honorary Secretary of the S.C.U., and Mr H. H. Whiteley, the manager of the Glenroy Hall Hotel, Bournemouth were planning to hold a short weekend Congress at the Glenroy Hall Hotel. The basis of the Congress was that the Hotel would make a charge for visitors that would include accommodation and meals for the Congress period or a small charge (as entrance fee) in case of local competitors, and that out of these charges the Hotel would pay all expenses and provide suitable accommodation. Mr Stevenson made himself responsible for adequate prizes, of which the Hotel gave a silver cup to be competed for in the principal tournament which would be open only to one nomination from each County.

Prior to the final arrangements being made, Mr Stevenson was taken ill, and Mr C. Gordon Bloke, then Honorary Secretary of the Kent Chess Association took over from him. He came to Bournemouth to meet Mr Whiteley and invited me, as Hampshire Secretary, to attend.

Arrangements were completed on the basis described above and a very satisfactory Congress was held.

At the Congress itself many people pressed that a similar short Congress should be held each year. Mr Gordon Bloke, as Controller of the Congress, and Mr Whiteley on behalf of the Hotel assured such enquirers that it would be made an annual event.

It will have been noted that no organised chess body was connected with the Congress officially, although their support had been asked for and obtained. The President of the Hampshire Association felt very strongly that any such chess affair should be organised by a recognised chess club or association, and he invited Mr C. Gordon Bloke, Mr J. A. Harris (Hon Secretary Bournemouth Club) and the Hampshire Association Secretary (P. C. Taylor) to discuss with him proposals for such Congresses to be organised for the future. There was no question of the 1937 Congress having been run in an unsatisfactory manner, but it was felt essential that some chess body should be

the organisers, and should be able to hold the Congress when and where would be most suitable for chess players.

Suggestions were made and subsequently put before and passed by the Hampshire Chess Association and the S.C.C.U. for the running of future weekend Congresses. These conditions were agreed to by Mr Whiteley on behalf of the Glamour Hall Hotel.

The following are the main features:-

1. The S.C.C.U. accepted ownership of two trophies for competition between nominated men and women representatives of Counties at a weekend Congress to be organised annually by the Hampshire Association. The Union would keep the selected weekend free from Union activities.
2. The Trophies referred to were the Glamour Cup, presented by the Hotel, and the Jeonford Cup, presented by Mr J. Spedan Lewis.
3. The Hampshire Association would organise the Congress completely, provide all chess equipment, pay all expenses and provide all prizes. Entrance fees, donations and association funds being used for these purposes.
4. The Hotel would be asked to quote a reasonable price which would cover food and lodging and the use of a suitable room or rooms for the play. The Hotel were not to be asked to subscribe in any way towards prizes or expenses, their whole contribution being in providing suitable accommodation.
5. Whilst giving no guarantee, the Association assured Mr Whiteley that as long as the arrangements that the Glamour Hall could make were not inferior than those that might be obtainable elsewhere they would continue to hold the Congresses at ~~the~~ the Glamour Hall Hotel.

The second Congress was held in 1938 under these conditions, and arrangements were almost complete for 1939 when War was declared.

Despite the fact that the Glamour Hall Hotel will almost certainly be under new ownership and management it should be possible to re-commence these Congresses under approximately the same conditions.

1938 Simultaneous Display by World Champion and Association Dinner at Bournemouth.

In arranging for a display by the World Champion it was desired to make the function a notable one, and neighbouring counties were each invited to send a representative to play and to attend the dinner which would follow the games. Six such guests were entertained.

Dr Alekhine played 30 boards who included most of the strongest players in the country, but he won 29 games and lost only one, to J. A Harris of Bournemouth.

Glampshire Chess Association.

Inter-club competitions.

At the sixth Annual General Meeting of the Association held on October 5th 1895 the first arrangements for team competitions were made, the following instructions being given to the committee:-

- ①. To open a Subscription List for the purpose of providing a Trophy to be competed for annually amongst the clubs of the County.
- ②. To prepare a scheme under which that Trophy shall be played for, such scheme to be so framed that the clubs in the smaller towns shall be able to compete on as nearly equal terms as possible with those of the larger towns.
- ③. To commence the first Annual competition for the Trophy not later than January 1896, and complete it by May 1896.

These instructions were duly carried out, and the resulting competition became known as the "Glampshire Trophy competition". It remained virtually the same until 1928, when the basis of team competitions in the County was altered.

It is therefore proposed to deal with the development of the competitions up to 1928 first, and it can conveniently be done under the three headings of the original instruction.

①. Provision of Trophy.

The subscription list was opened, and left open until the end of 1896. The Trophy was purchased in 1897 and is described in the accounts as:-

" One set of Finest Ivory Chessmen, No 1 full Club size, Staunton Pattern.

One County board, No 1 to match, Holly and Rosewood squares ($2\frac{3}{4}$ "). Board edged with Satinwood, solid Rosewood frame, Italian Walnut panels, French Polished "

The full subscription list is recorded in the financial accounts.

③. First Competition.

This can conveniently be disposed of next, a knockout competition was duly held, and was won by the Portsmouth Chess Club.

②. To prepare a scheme for the Competition.

The original instruction was for some form of handicap competition, and in the first season this was accomplished by insisting on the Southampton Chess Club entering two teams of equal strength. Handicapping in some form or other remained until 1928,

The league rules are not recorded, except certain amendments as they were proposed at annual meetings, but reference to these amendments and the season results shows that with the exception of 1903-4 the handicapping was only done by the larger clubs entering two or more teams. In 1903-4 a system of points handicapping was introduced, but no further mention is made of it. The Southampton and Portsmouth Clubs are the only ones who have ever been handicapped, in some years both clubs were made to enter as many as four teams.

The normal number of players to a team has been six, although it started at seven, and in one or two years was reduced to five.

A knockout competition was organised for the first two seasons, but it was then decided that for each team to play each other would make for more matches and greater interest, and that method has been adopted ever since. In some cases it has been necessary to play in two divisions, and for the divisional winners to play a final.

The Junior or Hampshire League competition.

In 1912 a junior competition was inaugurated, mainly to attract new and smaller clubs. Southampton entered two teams, and new entries were received from Eastleigh, Romsey, Hartley University and a second team from Andover. Two competitions were played, and then the War caused a break until the 1920-21 season.

The early rules governing the competition are not available, but from 1920 onwards a system of combined Trophy and League teams was used. Where a team entered for both competitions the top three players were barred from playing in League matches. Where opposing teams both played in both competitions a match of nine boards a side would be played, the top six boards counting in the Trophy competition, whilst the bottom six counted for the league. Had all teams competed in both competitions this system could have worked much more smoothly, but as it was the players who were eligible for both ^{leagues} ~~meets~~ had too many matches. Nevertheless the Junior competition did a very great deal of good in providing match play for many.

The Hampshire League 1928 - 1940.

At the 1928 Annual General Meeting it was decided to discontinue the old competitions, and to institute one competition, to be known as the "Hampshire Chess League". This competition to be run in two or more divisions, according to the entries and their strength. The principle of promotion and relegation to be adopted. Clubs entering two or more teams to enter definite first and second teams according to strength.

Rules were drawn up, which remain substantially unchanged, and are as recorded as in operation in 1940. The main change being that promotion and relegation is not automatic, as with the limited number of clubs and the big strength differences it was found that the method did not work satisfactorily. The main point of the present scheme is that it is definitely a club championship.

The Clubs in the Competitions.

Portsmouth, Southampton, Andover and Gosport were the teams in the first competition. Of these Gosport have since dropped out, but the others have remained in the whole time, and have formed the backbone of the competition. Bournemouth, although always a strong club numerically, have rarely entered, mainly owing to travelling difficulties.

Other fairly regular entrants have been University College Southampton (earlier known as the Hartley College), Winchester and Basingstoke, also, since their foundation in 1921 and 1925 respectively the Taunton's School and Old Tauntonians (Southampton) clubs have entered every year.

Shamshire Chess League Rules. (1939).

1. The League to be open to all affiliated clubs.
2. Teams shall be elected by the Council to a division.
3. Teams shall consist of five players.
4. The top four players of a club competing in two divisions shall be nominated at the beginning of the season, and they shall be ineligible to play in the second team. Further, if a second team player be called on to play in more than two first team matches during a season he shall thereafter be ineligible to play in the second team.
5. Where a club enters a team in more than one division their matches for the two teams shall be arranged for the same day.
6. No player shall play for more than one club during any one season.
7. All matches to be played as arranged by the secretary, or upon such date mutually agreed by the club secretaries, of which date the League secretary shall be notified.
8. All matches shall allow for at least three hours play.
9. Clocks shall be used in all Division I matches, and wherever possible in other divisions. The rate of play shall be thirty moves in seventy five minutes, and six moves in each succeeding fifteen minutes.

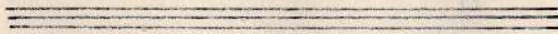

10. Visiting teams shall have the choice of move on the top board, the moves on the remaining boards alternating.

11. The score in all matches shall be sent to the honorary secretary within 24 hours of the match. All games not finished to be marked "A" on the score, and a diagram record of such games, stating the result claimed, and with a fee of 2/6 per game, shall be sent to the honorary secretary within seven days. Where the claim is upheld this fee is returned.

Note:- Both clubs to send the score and adjudications, and unless claims for adjudication are properly sent, an opponents claim may be given without adjudication.

12. Any disputes shall be referred to the Council, whose decision shall be final.

reasons for this were probably two letters he (THE HANTS SEC.) had written to the President & Secretary of the BOURNEMOUTH CLUB containing the following complaints:-

1. The B.C.C. had paid no affiliation fees to the County for the 1946-47 season, and - from the evidence of their Annual Statement of Accounts - had made no provision for such payments
