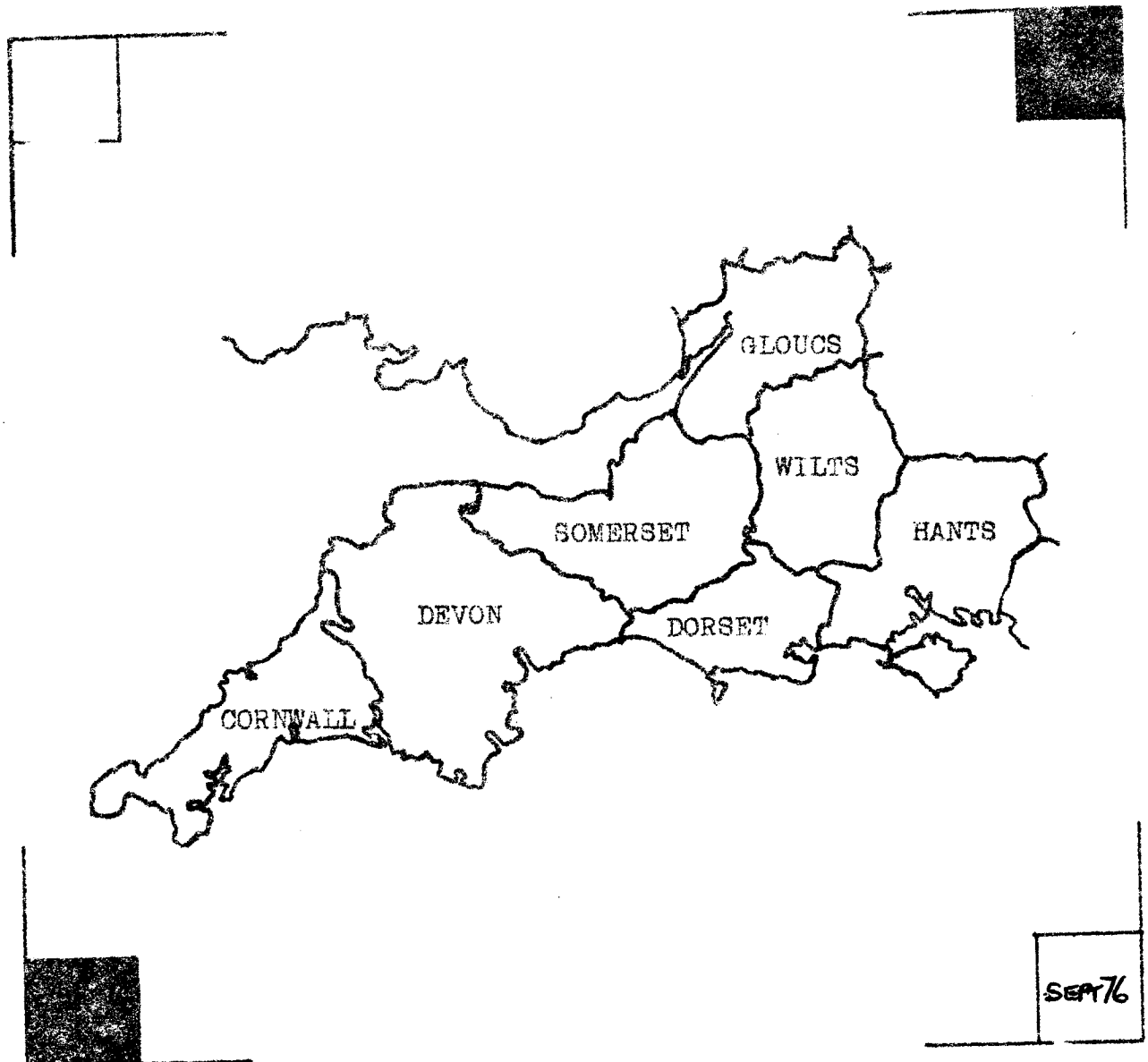

EDITORIAL

The main topic for the coming year will be the non-publishing of Grades of Non Registered players from the 1977 lists. I am publishing a number of letters on this subject. To me the W.E.C.U. must stand firm on this subject, it has been talked about for a long time. The other subject for discussion, and I hope action, will be the reorganisation of the B.C.F. Standing Committee. Members of the W.E.C.U. on the various B.C.F. Committees are putting the Unions views to the Federation.

REGISTRATIONS AND GRADINGS.

One of the most contraversial subjects that has been discussed over the years is whether chess players who contribute absolutely nothing to County, Union or Country should enjoy the privileges - or any of them - that are subsidised by the registered players. Without cash there would be no proper organising body and without cash chaos would shortly follow. With ever increasing postal charges, telephone bills, stationery and travelling expenses there is a need for a greater income and it is the registered player who has to provide this. Quite obviously the more players who register the lighter will be the burden for the individual and it is to this aim that we must strive. The non-registered player will of course protest most strongly that he gains nothing by registering. This of course is not so. He gets a grade - amongst a lot of other hidden benefits and others that are not hidden. The BCF, the Unions and the Counties would be able to provide even more benefits for the chess playing population if they had more funds available and action at long last is being taken. At the Council Meeting of the Western Union at which all counties were properly represented it was unanimously resolved to publish in the 1977 lists the grades for registered players and leave blanks against those unregistered. Grading is a costly matter and no longer will this service be done free gratis.

On BCF level discussions are already taking place to relate grading to finance and something must be done. If everyone whose names are published in the National and Union Grading lists paid their share, not only would there be more funds available to help chess players down to club levels, and amongst the unions, but the individual contribution would drop.

Why then all this fuss about paying the equivalent of half a gallon of petrol to ease the burden on the registered player?

Please give it a change and register and your Union and County will be grateful for the lightening of their financial burden.

Registration. By A.J.L. Wade (Registration Officer.)

The BCF has increased the Levy for 1976/7 by 20% making the individual Levy equivalent to 60p. per head.

The W.E.C.U. Affiliation Fee remains at 7p. per registration.

County Treasurers should note that the B.C.F. is allowing a 5% discount on each complete £10 of the Levy actually paid prior to the 30th. November, 1976, and 2½% Discount on each complete £10 of the Levy actually paid after that date but prior to the 31st. December, 1976.

It will simplify matters if County Treasurers will remit the B.C.F. Levy fees (together with W.E.C.U. Affiliation fees) to the W.E.C.U. Registration Officer in their gross amount i.e. without deduction of Discount. The Registration Officer will, immediately after the 30th. November and the 31st. December, remit to the respective County Treasurer any Discounts obtained. Please note that because of the vagaries of 2nd. Class Post, registrations intended to qualify for the 5% discount should be posted not later than the 23rd. November and for the 2½% discount, not later than the 20th. December, 1976.

Registration/Grading.

In future the Grades of Players who have not registered will not be published in Westward Ho. It is important that this should be widely publicised, not only in the Clubs which affiliate with the respective Counties, but also amongst those Leagues and Clubs which in the past have failed to register their members.

In this respect it is worthy of note that our records show that in the 1974/5 season there were approximately 1000 players in the West of England whose grades were published but who did not register and therefore made no contribution to the running expenses of the organisations responsible for their grading. With the increasing pressure on the finances of those organisations, this situation can no longer be tolerated, hence the above rule.

Dear Mr. Bond,

I was delighted to hear that at long last the grades of unregistered players will no longer be published.

The very small registration fee asked for by the B.C.F. costs no more than a decent pair of socks and is tremendous value for money. Not only do we receive a grading but we have the privilege of belonging to a first class organization, of helping in a very small way to further its aims and the opportunity to take part in its activities.

It does not seem to be realised by many people the large amount of time and energy that is expended entirely free of charge by dedicated people, graders, typists, helpers etc., in order that the grading system might operate.

In my opinion people who are so mean and parsimonious that they refuse to subscribe such a small sum to the B.C.F. don't deserve to be graded anyway.

I would congratulate you and your Committee on your courage in taking such a firm stand and I am sure you will have the backing of the majority of Chess players.

At our League Management Committee meeting on 7th. July, I have been asked to write to you regarding the resolution passed at your meeting of June 5th. 1976 to debar all non-registered players from the grading list.

The main complaint was that this was done without any consultation with our Chess League, representing 300 graded players. Roughly 600 players in the Bristol League play active league chess and for that the entry fee is £3 per team of 6. For that they get a year of competitive chess, about 20 league games, a team knock out competition and the possibility of entering individual championship competitions. Very few players are interested in county games and the usefulness of the larger bodies like the BCF and WECU has been questioned several times at A.G.M.s

Now I will have to explain to all the 23 affiliated clubs that unless players register with the BCF and in fact double their entry fee, they will not be graded.

A proposition at our meeting to withhold all Bristol League results from the grading officer was narrowly defeated and the question will possibly be brought up again later. If this proposition had been carried, it would have been very doubtful if more than a handful of Bristol players would have been graded, registered or not.

I have always thought it wrong to try and force people by sanctions, it usually means a lack of valid arguments and often has the opposite effect. In my opinion, for what it is worth, the WECU should reconsider their decision and convince players that they are getting a service they are not contributing towards. I would be glad to bring the W.E.C.U. point of view to our clubs notice.

CHESS2

The Bristol Open Chess Championships held at the Grand Hotel, Broad Street, attracted a large muster of players from places as far apart as Manchester, London, Torquay and Cwmbran.

Local players were there in plenty and two of these figured in the prize list for the Major event limited to competitors graded 139 and below. E.I.O. Biddick (Benham and Kingswood) shared first and second prizes with A. Wessori (Torquay), each receiving £32.50. Third prize of £40 went to Mr. M. Buchmaster (Shirchampton). The special prize for the best under 15 player went to Bristol's C.J. Brockes.

The following thirteen players scored four points each, just half a point below the third. L. Chambers, S.J. Knight and S.W. Maggs (All Bristol), L. Goodman (Bath), B. Doran and C. Bishop (both London), D. Peacock (Thornbury), A. Milner (Manchester), R.J. Wilkins (Cwmbran), A.J. Britton (Wantage), B. Blackburn (Streatham), F. Ellis (Llandeilo), C. Atkins (Orpington)

In the Amateur tournament for players graded 185 and below there was a photo-finish for the first place, three each scoring $4\frac{1}{2}$ to share the first three prizes, each receiving £68.35. They were J.C. Benjamin (Richmond,) M.K. St. J. Brown (London) and A.J. Knight (Welford).

Seven players, including two from Bristol and one from Bathm were half a point behind. They were R.A. Powell, M.E. Jones (Both Bristol), G. Moore (Bath), S.M. Fishburne (Manchester), J.K. Hodgson (Maidenhead), S. Cafferty (London), J. Hannen (Sidcup).

More Bristol names appeared in the thirteen scoring $3\frac{1}{2}$. They were K.W. Derrick, R.J. Johnson, R.A.J. Kendall, J. O'Loughlan and K Shipton (all Bristol), J.F. Fowhee (Yeovil), D.A. High (Taunton), P. Varley and J. Wates (both Newport), D. Smith (Caerphilly), R. O'Brien (London), K. Kyle (Basingstoke), P. Bonnafont (Hertford).

Prizes for the best scores by first round losers went to J. Hannan, D. Goodman and B.J. Wilkins.

B.C.F. NEWS

COUNCIL ... the BCF Council held its 72nd Annual Meeting in London on July, 10, 44 members attending. The meeting was the last chaired by Mr. James Rushton, retiring after the customary three years in office. Mr. Rushton's tenure has been marked by the unflagging energy and diligence with which he has shouldered the responsibilities of the President, and for the principles and integrity with which he has served the Federation's best interests. It is to be hoped that his services may not be lost to us. He is succeeded by Mr. C.E. (Ellery) Williams, of whom more elsewhere. All other officers were re-elected. Amongst business transacted by the meeting:

Accounts - the Treasurer's accounts show a surplus of nearly £1,500 over the past financial year. £1,000 of this will be invested in a 'Levy Equalisation Fund' as a reserve to offset future budgetted deficits to seek to avoid any early increase in levy.

Deputy President - this office was abolished, being regarded as superfluous. Levy appeals - the appeal procedure was revised, and levy appeals will no longer be heard in the last instance by the Trustees but by persons appointed by the Council.

Levy rebate - payment of levy made before 30 November 1976 (otherwise due 1 January 1977) shall be subject to a rebate of 5%; payment between 30 November and 31 December to one of 2½%.

Levy sum - the Council in April set an effective levy of £31.15 per point - this is now revised to £30.00.

Levy principles - extract from constitution as amended: "... it shall not be regarded as grounds for changing the Levy Number of a Territorial Affiliate that it does or may not control all chess activity within the said area ..."

Federation administration - the Development Committee is to follow its recent report by consulting with counties etc., and presenting a fully detailed structure plan, with specific proposals, no later than February next.

BCF services - as a matter of policy the BCF will seek to provide a leading player to counties to support promotional events. Cost and feasibility require detailed research.

English Deaf Chess Association - this body is now affiliated.

EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE ... met twice on July 10 before and after the Council. Mr. W.A. Cordon was elected Chairman. Amongst decisions made by the Committee; the Federation will appoint a National Junior Coach and allocate funds specifically for junior training; the Girls' Under - 18 Championship Final will in future be played over six boards, not four; Messrs Reuben & Clarke will be recommended for FIDE Judgeships.

CONGRESS RESULTS

Cotswold Chess Congress

The Annual Cotswold Congress was again held at Roxburgh House, Stroud over the Spring Bank Holiday and attracted 98 entries.

A facility much appreciated by the players was the non-stop provision of refreshments throughout the tournament. Bar-football, table tennis and television provided interesting diversions for those who finished their games early.

The tournament was ably controlled by Mr. R.O. Powis and was run in two sections; an open and a reserve.

There were, however, a few problems (especially on adjudications!) and it would greatly assist me in the publication of results and the keeping of records if these could be avoided. If the following procedure is adopted a lot of headaches will disappear:-

1. The names of the 14 players nominated for the English Counties to reach me by 11th. October, 1976.
2. All County results to be sent to me within 7 days of completion, together with appropriate board fees.
3. All adjudications to be sent to:-

The adjudication fee must be sent to Mr. Self at the same time.

4. Results of adjudications to be sent to me when received by the Match Captains.

I should be very grateful if Match Captains could pay particular attention to item 4 as last year I had to make calls to sort things out. One final request I would make. Most Match Captains kindly inserted the gradings of the players in their teams against the results. This is greatly appreciated and assists in lightening the load of our already overworked Union Grading Officer.

Interesting position at start of final round was that the leaders England with $5\frac{1}{2}$ points and Ireland with 5 had to play each other. Ireland required to win $2\frac{1}{2}-1\frac{1}{2}$ to take the trophy. If England and Ireland drew then Wales who were playing backmarkers, Scotland with only $1\frac{1}{2}$ points from the first 2 rounds, could win outright with a 4-0 victory. Neither eventuality arose for England made sure with a $3\frac{1}{2}-\frac{1}{2}$ victory and Wales went down to Scotland 1-3.

The top board game between the Welsh and Scottish Lady champions started at 2 p.m. was completed at 12-45 a.m. with a 3 hour break for dinner and prize giving ceremony - a total of $7\frac{3}{4}$ hours play.

Jane Seymour on top board found the going tough and scored two draws and a loss. The English captain, Jane Anson won all three games as also did Suzanne Wood, Jane Anson had a similar record last year so has won all six games she had played for England in the Faber Cup competition.

Over 50 Games were played at Debenham's Store in Plymouth during the Glorney Cup when Mrs. Bruce introduced French, Dutch and British Internationals. They played one afternoon at five minutes speed games. Two games were won against Glorney Players.

Sunday Times Competition.

Great Salterns School (Southern Grammar School, Portsmouth) retained the E. Giles Trophy by finishing runners up in the above Schools' Competition.

Thanks to the donations of Bristol players, clubs, the Braille Chess Association and Woodspring Association for the Blind, Colin Chambers of the Yatton club will be able to travel to Finland next month to represent England in the World Blind Team Chess Olympiad. Over £180 has been received to pay his fare there and Colin, in thanking all for their generosity, says that but for their help, he would have been unable to go. In the last Olympiad in Yugoslavia, Colin scored an excellent 8/11 to help England to sixth place of twenty competing nations. Out very best wishes go with him for a good performance and an enjoyable trip.

Peter Keffler, the county's Captain has the big whip out, and is reminding players to remain vigilant to the end of the playing time, July 31, as he feels that that only complacency can rob them of the Championship. His recipe for success, now, is that every game should be hectically contested to the end with half hearted draws being avoided like the plague. The Evening Standard London Chess Congress is being held at the Europa Hotel, Grosvenor Square, London W1 from Friday, July 30 to Sunday, August 1. The big event is the National Bank of Dubai Open Championship with a first prize of £1,000. Here the entry is totally unrestricted, but for the faint of heart or the lesser fry there are three other tournaments: the Amateur for players under 175 (Juniors 160). the minor, under 150 (Juniors 135) and the Novice, under 125 (Juniors 110) Each of these has a first prize of £100. Juniors refers to those under 18 at midnight on July 29. The tournaments are all six round Swisses, the first round starting at 6.30 pm on the Friday, with three rounds on the Saturday and two on the Sunday. Players under 170 in the Open and those in the other three tournaments may request a bye in the first round on entering for which they will receive half a point. Details can be obtained from Bryan Threadgall, 74, Valley Road, London SW 16.

This issue gives a History of the Club to Commemorate its thirtieth Anniversary which was attained on 2nd April 1976. It contains Statistics, photographs and anecdotes and traces the events of the Club through the year. It lists all the Officials, Teams and playing members with results and percentages since 1946. I see that G. Brunt has played 413 games over 30 years. A well worth magazine that took over six months to prepare.

The first General Meeting of the Kingswood Chess Club was held on 2nd April 1946 at Kingswood Youth Centre. This was a building in the Kingswood High Street and not in the modern premises in Orchard Road which were constructed some years later and used today for many functions including the varied activities of the Kingswood Youth Club.

Accommodation at the Centre was accepted to be that of a temporary nature only, and authorised by Mr. E. Biffen, The Area Youth Organiser, who was sympathetic to the Clubs' efforts to establish a meeting place in the neighbourhood. Conditions, however, were not particularly conducive to playing serious chess. Teenagers volleyed table tennis balls at one another, and in the adjacent hall, a record player produced the maximum decibels of pop music for the idolatry mass of youngsters to let off steam.

It was not surprising therefore, that in July of the same year, the Club moved to the Zion Methodist Schoolroom in Grantham Road. This necessitated changing the meeting night from Tuesday to Wednesday, but it was considered well worthwhile. £5-5-0 per annum to the Church, and 2/- per evening gratuity to the Caretaker were the terms agreed upon.

Members thought they had found a permanent home, and began to settle in. Alas, it so happened that Kingswood Community Association was interested in starting a Chess section, and as two or three Kingswood Chess Club members were also Community Association members, certain approaches were made to the Club expressing a whole range of benefits to be derived should members decide to affiliate with the Association and operate as a section of that Community whilst retaining its own identity. The motion was carried, and when the club met at the Arch, Kingswood, on 20th, March, 1947, none of the founder members only twelve months earlier could have dared to prophecy their headquarters would have changed with such rapidity.

In retrospect this move can now be regarded as having a very significant effect on the club. For seventeen years The Arch remained the H.Q. of the Kingswood Chess Club within a section of the Community Centre, and prospered through publicity given by the Community News, and Kingswood Observer. In May 1964, the Centre obtained the use of another building namely Romsdale House, situated in the High Street opposite the entrance to Kingswood Park. This was to be set aside for extra Community activities, and deemed by the Warden to be an ideal location for playing chess. Although functioning as an annex to the main block, it was well away from music and dancing, and the offer of three room and new tables, the club felt justified in making the move.

It wasn't until the winter months commenced that members grew aware of the disadvantages of this transfer. Inadequate heat and lighting, and the setting up of a ballet class were registered with scorned disapproval from members, but it was not until 1969 when Kingswood Community Centre sold Romsdale House that the Club were allowed to return to The Arch. With minimum space and dilapidated rooms, playing conditions were now even more preposterous than the Club had suffered at Kingswood Youth Centre, so much so that one visiting chess correspondent reported a match in a daily newspaper as being conducted under circumstances he had never previously experienced. (A door fell on his head during the game.)

An extraordinary General Meeting voted unanimously to find alternative accommodation, and when in June 1969 the Club had its first meeting at Hamham Folk Centre, it appeared like heaven alone. The impressive building with its spacious rooms soon attracted some top class players and membership began to grow.

Satisfaction reigned supreme however, until the warden Harold Turner retired, and a change of management put pressure on the club to become a section of the Community. They also set a target figure impossible to achieve, and in the summer of 1971, the Club packed its bags again.

Memory Hall was only one hundred yards away, and the transfer took place in the merry month of May. It could be said that the Club has witnessed the happiest days of its life during these last five years. Indeed its membership reached an all time high in 1972 when 52 names were on the register.

Unfortunately Memory Hall has been earmarked for demolition this summer, and the Club will make its eighth move in thirty years.

Negotiations have been successfully agreed with Hanham Methodist Church to have a room in the Community complex, and it is hoped our mutual friendship with the Church administrators will run parallel with those we have enjoyed with Hanham Old Age Pensioners since 1971.

THOSE CHESS PRODIGIES

(From the Western Morning News, August 24th 1971)

In the Westcountry in the next two months there will be at least three Chess congresses, one at Paignton, one at Weymouth and a brand new one at Barnstaple.

I would not mind betting that it will be the younger generation who will win the prizes. Those of us who are older will sit there watching them do it and also wondering how they do it.

Even those of us with only a smattering of chess lore cannot help noticing how many young people play chess nowadays, and how well they play.

There are, perhaps, three main classes of chess player in this decade; the good - that is, those under 15; the better - those between 15 and 20; the best - those between 20 and 25.

There are also some subsidiary classes in older age groups - those who still play chess; those who used to play chess; those who talk about chess; those who still go to chess congresses out of habit; and finally the large class of those fathers who find themselves in the position of being asked to have a quick game with little Bobby at Home.

OUTPLAYED

I wish I could think of some sensible advice to give to players of the older generation when confronted with the exuberance and accuracy of the young. I am beginning to think that school teachers do not teach the three R's any more. They concentrate on chess opening theory in the junior schools, move on to the middle game in the senior schools, and concentrate on end-game finesses in the universities.

Last month, in a Welsh congress at Hereford, I was out-played in the opening, stripped in the middle game and shattered in the end-game by a young man of 13. I was never really in the game at all; or perhaps we were playing different games with the same rules.

When I made a sensible move in the late middle game I leaned back with a sigh of relief. My opponent's head appeared at table level.

"You are going to spill your cigarette ash on your shirt," he said politely, as he moved his queen to a square I had not considered in my calculations. I felt a tingling in my scalp, a sensation that what was left of my hair was growing greyer.

LOSS OF PRESTIGE

Any advice I could give about the actual game of chess would not, it seems on this evidence, be very valuable. But I could perhaps outline a few of the ploys of chessmanship, which might help in the battle against the younger generation.

First, if you are not a regular player, but fancy a pleasant game at home, don't play against your youngest son. Make him do his homework, or, better still, send him to bed. Wait till he is out of the way and then play somebody of your own age. Great loss of prestige will occur if you do not follow this advice.

If, however, you are in a situation from which you cannot extricate yourself, if you are at a chess congress where you have to play a member of the younger generation, the following ploys may help.

Remember that your young opponent will play very fast. He will take about three seconds to play a move that Capablanca played in 1915 and that you have been thinking about ever since.

BE RUTHLESS

So play slowly. When he makes a move, don't rush at the board. Go and get a cup of tea. Then come back and have a look at the game. Raise your hand to move, then put it back in your pocket. Take out your pipe and carefully shred some tobacco. Above all, be ruthless. Don't have any "poor little fellow" ideas in your head. You are the poor little fellow.

It will be of little avail to offer him a cup of tea or coffee just when he is conjuring up some devilish combination to destroy you. He does not like tea and has never needed coffee as a stimulant. But a packet of sweets, artfully displayed, not proffered, may help. Do not eat them absentmindedly yourself, however. You have your waistline to consider, as well as your waning chess reputation.

You probably loathe both synthetic orange juice and Coca-Cola. But have a bottle of each, open in front of you. This is a ploy well worth the money. Your opponent may even hesitate in his devastating assault. He may even think you have bought one for him.

He is probably a well brought up little lad and has not the slightest suspicion that you would poison him if you had some arsenic handy.

A final word of warning about the "Go slow" ploy. Do not fall asleep. This is taking an unfair advantage of your young opponent, and will not do your generation any credit.

These words of mine are really a plea for sympathy and understanding, a plea to the more mature reader.

Whether you live in Penzance or Portsmouth, if you plan to send your son, a promising young player, to his first chess congress this autumn, give him the right answer when he comes home and says "It was super. But I had to play some awfully old people. One chap was nearly bald. He must have been over 30." Think of me and say to your son: "Well, it's only a game. Perhaps he was on holiday with his family and was playing a few games of chess for relaxation."

The problem of whether or not to take your family to a chess congress is a difficult one to solve. There are advantages and disadvantages. But you must remember that not every matron on holiday likes to be wakened at 2 a.m. after a lonely day, by having a pocket chess set thrust under her nose. Nor will she wish to be told how you won a pawn at 11 p.m. and after that everything was plain sailing.

Of course a family holiday gives the chess player something of an alibi. He can always excuse his lack of concentration in the afternoon by explaining that he has had an energetic morning building sand-castles for his grandchildren.

Perhaps, on the whole, and knowing that you will lose when playing against the ambitious and ruthless younger generation, it is better not to take your family for a nice holiday at the seaside at the same time as you are playing in a chess congress. Leave your wife at home and enjoy your misery alone.

LITTLE USE

If you are not in the first flush of youth much that you have stored in your memory will be of little use for dealing with the dashing emergencies that a young player will present to you. But do not despair. Remember that there will be other players of your generation who will be faced with the same difficulties.

And when your turn comes to play against one of the older players, you may be able to use, once again, the strategy you used so successfully at Hastings in 1920.
