I have been holding up the issue of this Bulletin pending receipt of the results of these adjudications, but have just heard that these are likely to be delayed because Berkshire got some of the positions wrong. #### Hampshire Chess Personalities

NO: 2 H.L. PARSONS

Began teaching Chess when himself still a boy.

Strong enough to give most players a run for their money (present grading 7a), his main claim to fame is his remarkable organising ability.

Formed Southampton Chess League in 1922 and was Secretary for 38 years (!) until 1960. Present state of League (4 Senior and 4 Schools Divisions catering for no less than 71 teams) speaks for itself.

Formed Taunton's School Chess Club and plays for Old Tauntonians in local League.

For some years has been S.C.C.U. Delegate for County, also one of our Honorary Auditors.

We must be sure to give him a job on the County Executive next year - such administrative ability should not be neglected!

(I forgot to mention last time that I am grateful to W.W. Rose of Cosham for the research which makes these notes possible).
