### GENERAL

Bulletin No. 3 described the circumstances whereby your Committee had come under heavy fire over a couple of unpopular decisions that it made early this season. I (and other individual members of the Committee) are still receiving the odd indignant letter, and it strikes me forcibly in retrospect that a lot of the bad feeling engendered stems from a misunderstanding of the subtle but far reaching changes in our Constitution that I asked for (and obtained) when I took over as Secretary.

Previously, this Association had been virtually run by one man (and our thanks are due to him for keeping us afloat over the years). I made it clear that I was not prepared to do this and demanded the creation of an Executive Committee.

The situation which now exists is that

- a) The Members in General Meeting elect certain individuals to the Committee.
- b) This Committee has been given full executive power by the Members in General Meeting.
- c) When the individual are asked to vote at a Committee Meeting, they are expected to do so in accordance with what they consider to be the best interest of the Association.
- d) Any decision thus reached becomes a decision made by the Committee (not by any individual or group of individuals on that Committee).
- e) The individual members have certain functions to perform as Officers of the Association. This they are expected to carry out to the best of their ability in accordance with the policy and regulations laid down by the Committee.

That is all there is to it really - the point being that it is a waste of breath and/or paper and ink telling me that I have spoiled the Individual Tournament or that Eaton has messed up the Hants League Competition. He and I have not done anything except cast our vote in good faith at a Committee Meeting.

As for the Hampshire League itself, I am personally pleased to be able to announce that the Committee has decided to offer the Clubs a

tournament for 1964/65 governed by exactly the same rules as are now in operation, as I consider these rules to be thoroughly workable and likely to serve us well for several years to come.

However, so as to avoid one of our alleged mistakes last year, (that Clubs had insufficient time to consider the rules and to decide whether or not they should enter), I am sanding an entry form and copy of rules with this bulletin to the Secretary of every Affiliated Club.

Let no man dare say next Autumn that he knew nothing about it.
