BLIND PLAYERS

I have been told of a very worthy enterprise being undertaken in Dorset and can do no better than reproduce in full the letter that I have received from the organiser -

Dear Mr. Grant,

Mr. J.E. Crewe of Bournemouth mentioned that he had mentioned our project to you at the Hants. C.C. Association meeting and he said that if I had more details then I should let you have them for publicity purposes.

I am very glad indeed to be able to obtain publicity for the project, so I am writing to give you a little of the background and the progress of the scheme.

EN PASSANT started in September as a result of an idea of mine and as a result of advice from B.H. Wood and R.W. Bonham of Worcester. It is financed by grants and donations for the formative period and the blind recipients are only asked for a subscription of 1/- per year.

Small tapes are sent to each listener each month. The tapes last for 16 minutes, and they contain exactly the sort of thing that normal printed chess magazine contain. They are recorded at  $3\frac{3}{4}$  inches per second on two tracks. At present we circulate to about 15 listeners and the numbers are rising at about one a day since the main notice of the scheme is the braille chess magazine, and we should eventually have about 100 listeners. We are also prepared to arrange for volunteers to visit those blind chess enthusiasts who don't have their own tape recorders. This should be able to be done through the local tape recorder societies.

We have received grants from the R.N.I.B., the B.C.F. and the Dorset C.C.A. and an appeal fund is open to provide the main finances for buying the small tapes that we use, as we don't want to lay the burden for the project on the blind themselves, who are quite often not able to earn to their full potential.

There are three things that we need .. and this is where publicity can come in.

- a) Blind Listeners ... if you know of any blind chess enthusiasts, then with their name and address we will write and offer our services.
- b) Copying help ... we duplicate about 15 tapes a month at present but this should go up to 100 and I need volunteers, with 2 tape-recorders to reproduce about 10 tapes each monthly.



## c) Contributions to the appeal fund.

We hope in the future to also have a library of analytical tapes, containing the same sort of thing as in Euwe's Archives, but this is much in the future at present; and we are concentrating on making the present scheme efficient.

If you can get us any publicity, I would be most grateful.

GRADING LISTS

A number of people have asked what has happened to the 1964 County Grading List. It is a long story, but briefly.

- a) Mr. Garner sent his figures to the S.C.C.U. Grader in the usual way. The S.C.C.U. Grader thereupon gave his opinion that all the Hampshire Gradings were too low in comparison with other Counties (something I have been trying to put across at Meetings of the National Grading Committee for several seasons).
- b) The S.C.C.U. Grader has kept our one and only copy of the 1963/64 figures with the intention of raising the question of a general up-grading at the next Meeting of the National Grading Committee.
- c) There seems little point in issuing a list which will be out-dated almost as soon as it is circulated.
- d) I am writing to our new County Grading Officer (J.E. Crewe) to ascertain his feelings on the matter. In the meantime, I can only ask you to be patient in the knowledge that we are aiming at issuing a comprehensive list as soon as possible which makes sense.
