BULLETIN NO. 5 of 1964/65

1 4 MAY 1965

The 1965 A.G.M. was held at Southampton Chess Club (to whom grateful thanks) on the 4th May and all the officers of the season now ending (with the exception of our President, who thesedays always passes on his office to another) were returned for a further year.

Seventeen members turned up (compared with 15 last year), so that the experiment of holding this Meeting on a week-night can presumably be described as a limited success.

On the whole, I was much happier with this A.G.M. than I was over the rather dismal 1964 affair. A good deal of useful business was carried out and I feel that I can best covey this to you by setting out the actual resolutions in full:-

- That Rule 9 be deleted in toto and that there shall be substitued therefore the following:-
 - "9. The Annual subscription shall be 15/- for a Vice-President and 10/- for a Private Member.

The Annual Affiliation Fee for Clubs shall be 2/6 for each registered member over 18 years of age on 1st. September of the commencement of the season in question, and 1/3 for each registered member under 18 years of age on that date, plus in both instances such fee as it shall be agreed to pay over to the S.C.C.U. and to the B.C.F. in respect of each registered player".

- 2. That a free copy of any County Bulletin or Newsletter shall be sent to each Vice-President and to the Secretary of each Affiliated Club, but that such publications shall be supplied to other individuals only on payment of a subscription of 5/- p.a.
- 3. That, in future, the Acceptance postcards sent out by the Match Captain shall not have postage prepaid by the County.
- 4. That no prize money shall be payable in future in the Individual Championship Tournament.
- 5. That the contribution to Junior Fares shall be paid over in one sum at the end of the season.
- 6. That, in the event of a Club having failed to pay its previous season's Affiliation Fees, the Secretary shall refuse to accept further Registrations of players from such Club until all arrears have been paid to the Treasurer.
- 7. That all applications for entry into the County Competitions shall be accompanied by the entry fee, and that no team or individual shall be eligible to take part in a competition if previous seasons' fees remain unpaid.
- 8. That the Committee make every endeavour to arrange that the 1965/66 Individual Championship Tournament shall be played as a Week-end Congress (preferably in Bournemouth) generally in accordance with the detailed recommendations put forward by Mr. L.E. Vine.
- 9. That the Winner and Runner-up of the Individual Championship Tournament shall in future have the right (should they so wish) to play first and second boards respectively in all County Matches.

Incidentally, I received a sharp rebuke in a letter from a member who said that I was all wrong in painting such a gloomy picture. What I should say in these Bulletins and my Report is that things are fine, and then everyone will brighten up and wish to support the County. In this case, may I say that we have an enthusiastic and increasing membership, a large proportion of which fought out the Individual Championship. All Hampshire League Matches were played in a keen and friendly atmosphere, we won all our County Matches the Bank Balance has never been better and everything in the garden is lovely.

Not all posts were filled at the A.G.M. and the Committee are looking for a volunteer to act as Publicity Officer and Bulletin Editor. Not a particularly onerous job but one needing Typewriting and Duplicating facilities. Any offers?
