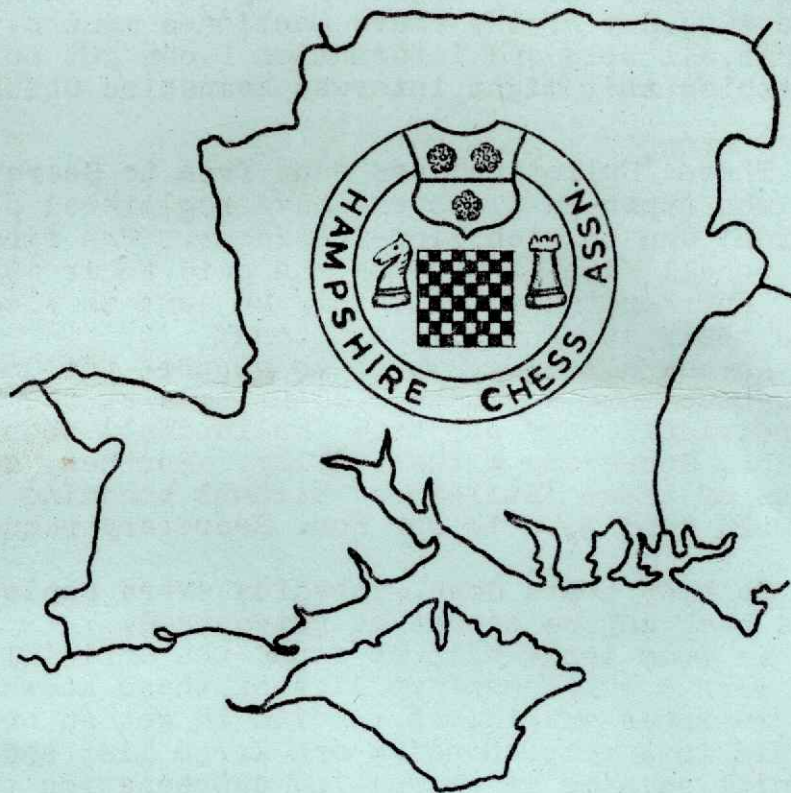

The following details were approved by the Association's Committee, which met at Southampton on 22nd September last.

The Championship will be played at the Mathematics Building, Southampton University in Room 7B.

The hours of play will be as follows:-

Fridays 27th Oct. & 3rd Nov.	6.15 PM till 10.15 PM.
Saturdays & Sundays 28th/29th Oct & 4th/5th Nov.	9 AM till 1 PM & 2.30 PM till 6.30 PM.

Rate of play: 24 moves to the hour, ie., 48 moves in 2 hours and one time check at the end of 2 hours.

Entrance fee is 10/-

The Tournament to be on Swiss lines (10 rounds)

All unfinished games to be adjudicated by the Conductor whose decision will be final.

Entrance forms direct to Mr A.C. Barton, 8 Portal Road, Totton, Southampton by WEDNESDAY, 25th OCTOBER LATEST, together with the entrance fee. No entry will be accepted unless the fee is paid before the tournament commences.

For unfinished games both players must hand in a score sheet with an adjudication form showing the position.

Players are requested to bring clocks.

In the event of ties in the final scores, these will be broken by the method of opponents' scores.

The Controller of the Tournament will be Mr A.C. Barton.

Despite this being called the Senior Individual Championship, this does not exclude Juniors taking part who wish to get strong match practice opposition.

QUALIFICATIONS FOR A PLAYER TO PLAY FOR THE COUNTY

The qualification of a player to represent a county in a competition shall be membership of the County Association, either direct or through an affiliated club, together with registration with the Federation and one of the following conditions: -

- a) Birth in the county.
- b) Five years consecutive residence in that county at any time.
- c) Three months' immediately previously and present residence in that county.
- d) Two years' immediately previous and present membership of a club in that county.
- e) Attendance as an undergraduate at a university in that county.
- f) Attendance as a master or pupil at a school or college in that county.

ITEMS CHESS PLAYERS MAY LIKE TO KNOWENVELOPE POSTMARKS

The practice of using window, or other types of envelopes, MORE THAN ONCE for postal Chess, or other forms of correspondence, is now made somewhat difficult by the Postal Authorities Ruling that ALL PREVIOUS POSTMARKS MUST BE completely covered, or the envelope will be surcharged despite a new stamp being affixed to it.

This has probably become necessary through the use of electronic sorters by the G.P.O.

B.C.F. LIFE MEMBERS

The recent poll elected Mr J. Graham, 'Trees', 325 Chickerell Road, Weymouth, Dorset to represent Life Members on the B.C.F. Executive Council. He states he will be pleased to hear from any B.C.F. Life Members who have suggestions, comments, queries or complaints that they would like raised with the Federation. He will also answer all letters.

Having been asked to include an interesting game in each Bulletin, I have to face the fact that my own personal Chess leaves much to be desired. Thus anybody willing to send me a game score with suitable remarks will be doing me a real favour.

This month I invited Mr M.J. Roth, the reigning regional Bournemouth Individual Champion, to give me what he thought was one of the best games in winning his title. He has chosen his game against the well-known Senior County Player, past holder of the title and Chairman of the Bournemouth and District League, Mr E.W. Chandler.

Mr Roth had the White pieces and the game opened up with a Sicilian Defence - Dragon Variation - and a Yugo-Slav attack followed. The order of some moves were a little unusual, Black playing P-KN3 early and N-KB3 late, whilst White played P-KR4 late. Neither of these are believed to be critical but, as so often happens under the various strains encountered, there were blunders before the end.
