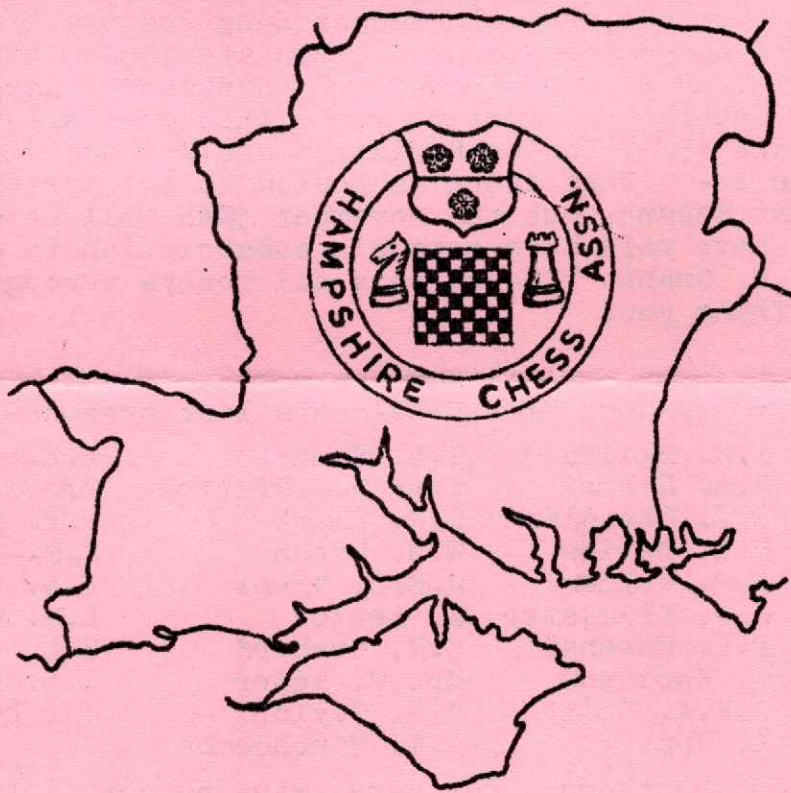

THE COMING SEASON

Hampshire, having had such a wonderful run last season, quite naturally must have been quite happy with the shape of things in general and could hardly be expected to wish for any change.

However, certain other counties with much bigger memberships than ours were not pleased and complained of having great difficulty in getting representatives sides to travel outside the Metropolitan area with the result that their teams were not representative of their true strength.

Middlesex expressed such sentiments strongly and with well over 600 affiliated members to the Union, they have a voice which, in fairness, must be listened to and met where possible.

The result was that the Union Executive considered matters closely and decided to submit changed plans to the Union Council meeting. The Council meeting in turn finally adopted the new order for this season by a majority vote and it is now up to all concerned to try and see if it can be made to work.

Already troubles are looming up with an outside possibility of Hampshire being squeezed out of the Amboyna Competition through being unable to find 6 other counties willing to meet them - only 4 Amboyna matches have so far been obtained. As already our Amboyna fixtures includes travelling to Essex at Chelmsford, refusal to travel is not Hampshire's trouble, but it looks like it is a side effect of the system adopted, quite unforeseen.

It is early days yet, but it makes the publishing of a fixture list even more difficult than the new system adopted already is.

The new Scheme divides the 14 Counties into 3 preliminary groups with the two leaders in each group passing on to a second series in the New Year to decide the Championship proper, whilst the Counties failing to get into the final six can continue play for the Montague-Jones trophy, which becomes a sort of lesser County Championship. These teams are for 20 players.

The Amboyna and Ebony competitions are now separate and virtually become a Junior and Minor competition for teams of 25 players. A change is that everybody can enter the Ebony Competition instead of just the Metropolitan Counties.

It was agreed that the new system should be home and away matches with the first named team having the choice of venue. I am thus extremely sorry to find that the Fixtures Secretary add a paragraph at the end of his official document saying 'It is hoped that most teams will agree to play in London, so that the developing struggle for supremacy in the final rounds can be more easily followed in the coincident matches, with greatly heightened interest'.

It is my real hope that Hampshire will strongly oppose this fully for it is virtually saying that Hampshire, who would have to travel to play in London, would have to field a weaker side than is possible in Hampshire. Why should this County be put in that position when we now have a right to play half our matches in Hampshire.

Whilst this position must be watched and nothing final will be known until Mid-December, We must also all do our best to make an effort to make the most of this new system and co-operate when practical. For instance, I do think we should agree to play at a half-way venue when both teams have to travel about the same distance because neither team would be more travel-tired than the other and expenses will be approximately equal.

Looking ahead I fear this is the start of what could prove to be a very cold wind for the County Championship as a whole. I cannot help thinking that the S.C.C.U. authorities have got to make these County Championship matches very much more attractive, or find the best players choosing to play in local weekend tournaments for cash prizes in preference to the County match with travel and no hope of more than 'glory'.

This could mean cash prizes for good performances in matches or, in the other direction, prohibit weekend tournaments on dates scheduled for County matches. The above is a personal view, which I hope others will share.

On these last 4 dates, whether and who Hants will play depend on the outcome of the first three matches. Should Hampshire fail to get into the final County Championship pool of six, then the same dates may be used for the playing of the Montague-Jones matches with other counties failing to get into the Championship 6 pool.

It is hoped to hold the Team Lightning Championship again this year, but the date is uncertain at the time of writing, especially so as it will have to fit in with the Junior Programme as well as the Seniors.

JUNIOR EVENTS

- Nov 11th Southampton Schools Senior Lightning Team Tournament at the Richard Taunton College, starting at 6 PM for the Under 16 & 14 and at 7 PM for the Open (I believe that means under 18).
- Nov 28th Annual Southampton Schools League v. Portsmouth Schools League at Beechwood Middle School at 3 PM. (I think this an unfortunate date as it might prevent one or two good Juniors from playing in the County Senior Individual - however other dates might be equally impracticable.
- Dec 30th to Jan 1st. Southampton's Schools' Annual Christmas Tournament at the Deanery School (Argyle Road Annexe)
- The Spedan Lewis Team Trophy Jamboree for Under 15's will be at the Beechwood Middle School, Southampton on a Saturday in the Spring Term - date uncertain. (What about a few Bournemouth entries this year?)
- May 15th. This is the suggested date for the Southampton-Bournemouth "Echo" Match, probably be played at Eastleigh as Bramtoco venue unavailable.

Your Editor would like views as to whether a repeat of the Lightning Individual Championship is desirable or not. It could probably be arranged if there was sufficient interest.

Both Bournemouth and Southampton Senior Leagues have new teams starting this season and Fareham has also entered the Southampton League as well as the Portsmouth League. Good wishes to all.

SOUTHERN COUNTIES FINAL

Hampshire met Cambridge, the new English County Champions, in the final of the S.C.C.U. Championships and beat them to win the S.C.C.U. Championship in addition to other honours won earlier in the season 69-70. Unfortunately both sides were well below full strength - another pointer towards the decreasing interest over the years.

- e = Hampshire (If either of these two fail to qualify,)
- f = Sussex (insert Kent or Bucks in place.)

This means Hampshire will be home (if successful in getting through to the last six) on Jan 16th and Feb 27th)
