

that registrations will be strictly enforced this season. Players
who register with one club to play in a certain competition
requiring registration should note that they are only registered
for other competitions if they play for the same club. Playing for
a second or third club in various competitions demanding registration
means registration for each club. Don't blame me. this is the rule means registration for each club. Dont blame me, this is the rule and I have to stick by it like everybody else.

We encountered some trouble last year on Registrations

and were rightly penalised because 3 names used were not in our official list of registered players - one could be the use of wrong initials and the others oversights or errors somewhere. Too bad, but lets try and see it does not occur again - I will, in a minute or two, advise anybody whether some particular person is registered or not - quicker still if you know the club the person plays for; dont hesitate to ask - be sure. I underline players not registered in future when registration is essential but am not witch-hunting for them. Being editor of this and Union Chess Fare does keep me in close touch.

B.C.F. YEARBOOK

The new issue of the B,C.F. Year Book, 1970-71, price 6/and postage 9d. Once again it is has within its covers volumes
of information, including Lightning Chess Rules,, Adjudication
Rules and Annotations Service Rules, etc.

The LIGHTNING CHESS rules are of particular importance. Commonly played in Hampshire and many other Chess circles is the rule that if an opponent leaves his King in check, his opponent takes the King off and wins the game.

The NEW OFFICIAL RULE IS that the player giving check MUST announce it to be effective. Without such an announcement, the player failing to move out of check will not be penalised for making

an illegal move.

Whilst this is sound thinking in conform to Chess Law, I do forsee trouble in numerous players giving check at a close adjacent game which could to lead to confusion when a number of boards are

in close approximity.

Probably better would have been that a finger should point to the enemy king and the piece giving check immediately on making the move, or possibly just lift up the opponent's king as a sign of check being given. Multi-Check Calling - all at the same time - does not appear desireable, though only experience will prove the point.

IRISH CHESS UNION

Details of this Union are included in the B.C.F. Year Book, I believe, for the first time, together with the addresses of the 3 Irish Chess Unions, Leinster, Munster and Ulster.

Many advertisments of coming congresses and other data are to be found, with thousands of addresses for putting one in contact with Chess circles in any part of the British Isles. Results and statistics abound - you name it and all important things are there.

Registration figures make interesting reading - will Middlesex be the first County to Register over 1,000 members, they have a fair chance this year to be the first to achieve this land-mark. Kent, Essex and Lancashire have all well over 500, whilst this figure must be the aim of Surrey and Leicestershire.

Hampshire, as the Champion S.C.C.U. County, salutes and welcomes the new B.C.F. President, P.S. Milner-Barry, Esq., C.B., O.B.E. and all will wish him a fruitful and pleasant term of Office. It is difficult to think of anybody better suited to fill this post vacated by Dr C.G. Addingley Esq., Ph.D. after his full term of 3 years in Office.

Whilst many Chess Officials and others will regret the loss to active Chess operations of Mr I. Cohen, B.C.F. Treasurer for so many years, one must agree he has well earnt his retirement, thank him for all he has done and wish him years to see a continued expansion of the work he started.

Finally this Year Book contains an important translation by Martin E. Morrish of the "Interpretations made by the permanent Commission of THE FIDE for the Laws of the Game.

This is something which all who enter competitions should read and learn so that YOU WILL KNOW.

WELL-KNOWN PLAYER LEAVES HOSPITAL.

I am sure all will rejoice with me to learn that Mr M.W.J. Thompson, one of the best known and strong Hampshire players, left Hospital on Nov 12th and, following a period of convalescence, we all look forward to his return to the Hampshire County Championship side. All wish him a complete recovery with many years of good health ahead of him.

Gentlemen, year after year we hear of unfortunate clubs being kept out of this League and our Association seems to be quite happy in letting this state of affairs continue. How often does one hear of other Leagues turning customers away? Mostly customers

are welcomed with open arms elsewhere - its only good business.

I believe the primary cause to lie in the League's Rules, especially the rule which calls on clubs to apply for entry by a certain date each year. Added to this, the principle of Officialdom has been the strick appliance of the rules and nobody can really blame Officials for that - if anything it is to be welcomed.

Added to this, we again say 'Goodbye' to the Second Division,

for how long this time?

May I suggest the whole thing of this sorry story can be cured by a simple change of the Hampshire League Competition Rules (Revised 1963) etc., by the following alteration to Rule 1.

'Delete all after Unaffiliated Club' and 'Add' Stop

The Controller will enter all clubs playing in the previous season, unless he has received notice to the contrary by Oct 1st. New clubs wishing to enter the League shall notify the Controller of their desire by the same date.'

Lots of arguments for and against this can be raised, but where clubs do fall out unexpectedly, Rule 9 (b) will take care of such matters and we get rid of that (to me) awful indignity of telling clubs they are too late to enter. If anybody has a better wording to mean approximately the same thing, your Editor will be

pleased to hear and publish such views.

They all play as many games as they like, scoring 5 points + or - one tenth of the difference of their handicaps ie., Manderson playing Thomas in the above positions - Manderson winning would score 5 -3 = 2. Thomas get -2. If Thomas won, he would score 5 + 3 = 8 whilst Manderson Manderson would score -3. This could have real merit for a new type of handicap, play as you please.

Farnborough won the Beaumont Cup last season (2nd Division of Surrey League) and are promopted to the Surrey Trophy (Div 1.) this Season. Firstly, players who play games with a difference of 40 or more grading points will be treated this season as having a difference of 40 points maximum. Thus a player graded 200 playing a 130 grader and drawing would score 160 and the 130 player would score 170. I understand this is yet a further attempt to stop players' grades falling annually through inaccuracies of the calculations, particularly the grading figures of the stronger players. Similarly, if the higher graded player lost, he would score 110, (being minus 40 & 50) not as last Season minus 50 of 130, ie., 80.
