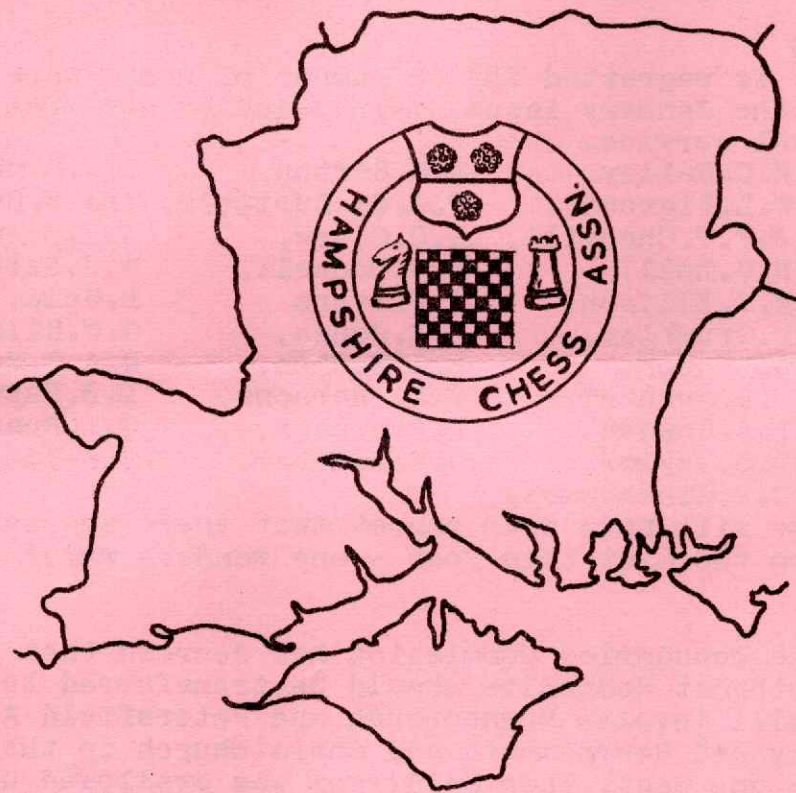

THE FUTURE

The Boundaries Commission has decreed that parts of Northeast and Southwest Hampshire should be transferred to neighbouring counties. This will involve Farnborough and Petersfield Area to the N.E. of the County and Bournemouth and Christchurch to the S.W.

In the past, when Middlesex was swallowed up by Greater London, Chess authorities then decided to keep the old Middlesex boundaries and to retain it as a county unit. Already with only a few years past, one has had queries as to which side of the old line some people live and the answer is often made difficult through new buildings, roads and such like.

Whilst it will mean a big uprooting for us older people if the county moves with the times and accepts the new lines - to my mind the obvious thing to do is to march with the times - it will mean that Hampshire would virtually become a compact 'Solent City Area' with only what was the cradle of Hampshire Chess, Andover, being any distance from the main area. This could have considerable advantages of compactness, whilst the playing strength of Southampton University, growing and growing, could well compensate for the apparent immediate loss.

If this line is adopted, Hampshire should search for a replacement Publicity Officer and Bulletin Editor, so as to have an answer to the loss of the S.W. People. May I say I should still be prepared to do the Duplicating if desirable, provided somebody in close contact cut the stencils.

S.C.C.U. FIXTURE LIST 1971-72 SEASON

Hampshire will again play in section 3 with Berkshire, Kent and Sussex for the opening stages of the Championships before Christmas and are again allotted the letter 'e' for the 1972 part of the season, so that, should they again qualify for the Championship, they will (in theory) obtain the benefit of reciprocal arrangements for Home and away matches.

- 16th E - B (B=Essex at moment) or M.J. Match.
- 25th B.C.F. Junior Counties Final.

Looking at these fixtures, the Hampshire Senior Championship, assuming it is to be played on similar conditions to previous recent years, will have to taken place between Oct 16th and 23rd weekends, or Nov 27th and Dec 4th. At the moment October dates would appear to be the most likely as Hampshire always in the past has held their Individual O.T.B. Championship early in the Season.

IMPORTANT DATE

I understand that Beechwood School Hall has been booked for May 1st, 1971, for the Hampshire Team Lightning Championship. Teams of 4 players and entries to Mr P.M. Collins, 35 Kent Road, St Denys, Southampton as soon as possible please. Entries must reach the Conductor at the address given by Friday, 23rd April together with 50p, the entrance fee of each Team. Teams should bring three boards and 3 sets of men with them and arrive at Beechwood School by 2 PM so that play may start by 2.15 PM sharp.

It is hoped that even more teams than last year will join in to make an entertaining afternoon's play.

OBITUARY

It is with deep regret that I have to record the passing away of one of Hampshire's Honorary Life Vice-Presidents, Mr J.N. Fishlock-Lomax. Mr Fishlock-Lomax will long be remembered for the good he did for Hampshire Junior Chess with the Butlin Bognor Championships. A F.I.D.E. International Chess Judge and one of the best Congress organisers this country has ever known, I know all will extend their deepest sympathies to his wife and family. No flowers but donations to Canser research was suggested.

I am holding up the publication of this issue from here on in order to be able to include decisions at the Meeting of the Hampshire C.A. Executive scheduled for April 1st. This should enable me to announce decisions regarding the Kinson Community Association Chess Congress with particular reference to the Under 18 and 16 Juniors, the date of the coming Annual General Meeting and such like so that this news will have the widest possible circulation and I thus apologise for the late arrival.

HAMPSHIRE COMMITTEE MEETING - 1-4-71.

It is with the deepest regret that I have to report that this Committee, by a majority vote, passed what can only be a VOTE OF CENSURE on the Hampshire League Conductor, Mr P.M. Collins. It is my personal view that Committees should support their Officers and I should like here to tender my personal apology to Mr Collins for having failed to get the Committee to support him, whilst, at the same time, as your Editor, it is my duty to present the facts to you as correctly and honestly as possible.

The Committee took the Hampshire League business first as Mr Collins was due at a table tennis match later the same evening. Somewhat surprising Messrs S. Weeramantry and B.F. O'Sullivan were allowed to be present through the whole of the discussions & voting on Hampshire League matters - thus making the matter public.

The first League matter to be raised was the failure to play the Kinson-Southampton University League fixture.

Pre Limit-Date evidence was not admitted before the Committee but subsequent enquiries lead me to believe that the University Secretary, Mr Southcote-Want wrote to Mr Dulson, Kinson Chess Club Secretary (I suppose one should say 'Overall') somewhere about a week before the Limit Date (Nov 14th I believe) saying that they had not heard from Kinson where to go for the match and thus it was now too late for the University to arrange a team for the limit date. Mr Dulson passed this letter on to Mr G.H. Bennett, the then Captain/Secretary of the Kinson Hampshire League side. I am told Mr Bennett phoned Mr Southcote-Want and it was agreed the date be re-arranged for Dec 9th. If this is accurate and I see no reason why not, this explains why the League Conductor permitted the postponement after the limit date instead of scoring the match 0-0 (completely in accordance with the rules).

Unfortunately on the 9th, Kinson turned up and Southampton University failed to appear - at the immediate time without explanation.

Subsequently a letter dated 10th Dec was received by Mr Dulson from Mr Southcote-Want apologising for their non-appearance.

The letter went on to say "Everything was planned when Mr P.H. Collins, whose car^{was} were to travel in, told us that the car had broken down. The only other possibility was to come by train - but this we rejected because we were not sure of being able to get to your club from the station, and in any case this would have been too expensive for us - particularly at the end of term".

I hold that letter now and it does not seem to suggest the 'impossible to attend' view put before the Committee.

Subsequent contacts failed to produce a further date suitable to both sides and the position was complicated by Mr G.H. Bennett handing over the Kinson Hants League Captainship/Secretaryship to Mr J.A. Bassett - the former joining the Staff of Chess, Sutton Coldfield.

By mid-March Mr Bassett informed Mr P.M. Collins, the Hampshire League Conductor, that no date had been agreed, which resulted in the following letter being sent from Mr Collins to Mr Bassett and received by Mr Bassett on the morning of the Essex match, March 20th which reads (Written on official Hampshire note paper and which I now hold) "Many thanks for your letter. I have given the University ample opportunity to contact you (and/or Mr Dulson) so it must now be Kinson 5 University 0 (Default). He then goes on to give the League table and discuss the Fareham-Kinson adjudications. This represents a positive decision by the Hampshire League Conductor which the League Committee over-ruled on April 1st and ordered the Conductor to contact both Club Secretaries and for him to fix a date when the clubs must meet, or lose by default.

The Conductor's decision in favour of Kinson almost certainly gave the League Championship to Kinson, whereas Committee's decision virtually gives the Championship to Southampton as Kinson are almost fully booked until after Whitsun.

Two Southampton representatives were on the Committee of the Hampshire Chess Asn which over-ruled the Conductor's decision. I do feel their vested interest should have been declared at the Committee Meeting and ethics required them to submit facts, refrain from discussion and voting. Such would have allowed me to take a very different role than that of appearing to champion Kinson in the absence of a representative from them, they thinking the matter closed by the conductor's letter.

The Committee's discussions then turned to the Fareham-Kinson match and a discussion ensued as to whether Kinson should be allowed to appeal against the Adjudicator's decision if they should make one. No official voted-on decision was taken on this BUT the majority opinion was that the H.C.A. Secretary should not allow such appeal - unlike their decision for the Conductor, they felt they should uphold the Adjudicator's position. Illogical and certainly not normal chess procedure. However I should say I agree with that decision for QUITE DIFFERENT reasons - Kinson had sent in no fee with their adjudication claim and so by rule should lose their claim. I only learnt of this later and one wonders why it was not brought up. Possibly the real answer to this mess was that nobody really knew all facts and hence warped judgments resulted.

I think I should add I told the Chairman I felt these matters were dealt with in an unfair and unjust way. It would have been so much better if Mr Southcote-Want, Mr Dulson, Mr Bennett and Mr Bassett had been available to present their first-hand knowledge accurately - the three Kinson persons being necessary because each played parts at times.

Finally only ^{on} rare occasions do I play in the Hants League and then for Bournemouth Knights - I am not worried whether Southampton or Kinson win but I must look for correctness and justice.

For those interested, the Fareham-Kinson position adjudicated a draw and on which I understand Kinson are still seeking learned opinion as to whether they should appeal, is as follows, forsythe notation starting from A8, downwards. 3r2k1, p4p1p, b3p1p1, 2P5, 1q6, 2R1RBPP, 2Pr1P1K, 4Q3. It will be seen that Black should almost certainly go a Pawn down through being unable to defend both Pawns on c2 and c5 but with so many major pieces still on the board, and despite Black's pieces being very tied-up, I very much doubt if any adjudicator would give it as other than a draw and so, if Kinson want to waste their money on it, why not? (Fareham White, Kinson Black) Next move Black.

The Publicity Officer drew the Committee's attention to the fact that a number of Hampshire Players were unregistered and asked for some action to rectify this state of affairs. This particularly applies to some Correspondence Chess players and unfortunately the Conductor, Mr Russell, was not present to follow the matter up.

It was decided to hold the Hampshire Team Lightning Championship again at the Beechwood (Middle?) School - same venue as last year. Entries should be sent to Mr P.M. Collins, 35 Kent Road, St Denys, Southampton to arrive at his address not later than Friday, 23rd April so as to give him a weekend to draw up the necessary score-sheets, etc.

Play will start at 2.15PM on May 1st and teams should aim to be present by 2 PM. Entrance fee with request to be entered, actual fee 5Op per team. Any team can enter and registration is not called for in this event. Mr P.M. Collins will be the Director/Controller and your Editor would provide tape recorder, etc. It was felt that the additional large speaker was not necessary.

The ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING was fixed for 9th June, 1971 commencing at 7 PM, at Southampton University as usual. Should some unforeseen reason cause a change, notification will be published as best practical. Please try and attend, and make it a truly representative meeting.

Your Editor reported to the Committee the views expressed on page 4 under the heading of 'THE FUTURE' and this item has nothing to do with the Committee matters reported herein.

Unfortunately our Treasurer was not at the Meeting and so a full review was not taken on financial matters.

The Secretary took note that certain changes in the Hants League rules should be considered at the A.G.M. with a view to improving the working of the League, this to include consideration of altering the rule which persistently causes some unfortunate club to be omitted for a season. Other points were also mentioned and noted.

COUNTY MATCH RESULTS:-

Since the second half of the S.C.C.U. County Championship started in January, Hampshire have done badly indeed and it is difficult to see them finishing anywhere but bottom of the table.

I am, however, quite certain that the real cause of this failure is due exclusively to having to travel long distances to each match. When this new system was introduced, it was on the clear understanding that counties could insist on playing half their matches at home on the home and away basis, yet for Hampshire it has become one long travel with all away matches from the player's point of view. This means tired teams arriving to play and lost matches. We have only one match scheduled within the present borders of Hampshire for the whole of 1972, whilst another county has 7 out of 9 matches within their home area. This is not equality of chances.
