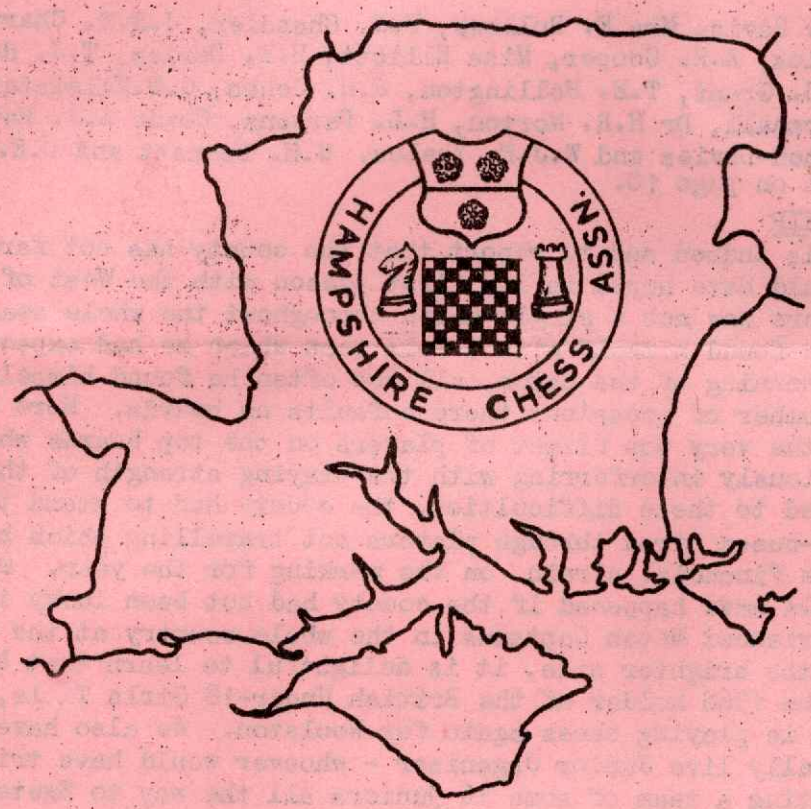

COUNTY CHAMPIONSHIP

It is indeed sad to report that the county has not fared as well as many of us would have hoped in its first season with the West of England Chess Union. There was not a single match throughout the whole season in which the Match Captain found himself with a full team which he had expected to turn out on the morning of the match, all too often he found himself playing and still on a number of occasions there defaults on boards. More often than not it was the very top flight of players on the top boards who did not appear, thus seriously interfering with the playing strength of the side.

Added to these difficulties, the county had to stand the loss of fares in mini-buses hired through players not travelling which has resulted in a considerable financial strain on the working for the year. One wonders what would have happened if the county had not been lucky in having one of the most experienced Match Captains in the whole country at the helm.

On the brighter side, it is delightful to learn that Miss Gilliam Moore, the 1968 holder of the British Under-18 Girls Title, has returned to Hampshire and is playing chess again for Woolston. We also have got the services of a really live Junior Organiser - whoever would have tried and succeeded in getting a team of some 16 juniors all the way to Exeter to play in the Union Junior Jamboree. The journey for some from Portsmouth must have been tiring enough but despite this our girls came 2nd behind Devonshire, who had little tiring journeys. The Boys felt the strain of the journey more and should have been placed higher than they were. Well done Mr T.E. Hollington.

One other really bright spot is the performance this season of the young Bournemouth Schoolboy, P.R. Davies. Not only has he won the Bournemouth League's Senior title with a score of 6½/7 against all comers, but also looks like winning the Under-15 title also with one more match to play against the even younger G. Charters. With other young players from the Portsmouth area like G.E.J. Lambert and P. Lee being added to Southampton's B. Andrews, the county's outlook for the future cannot be bad.

With possible re-arrangement of the Bulletins next season, this issue is held over until after Easter so as to get such Congress results as possible reported - currently this is expected to be the last issue this season.
