A good example of a win by means of forcing one or more remote passed pawns comes from the game Kotov v. Botvinnik (U.S.S.R. Championship 1955). From the diagrammed position Black plays 59...P-N4; 60. BPxP (if 60. RPxP P-R5; 61. B-Q6 B-B4; 62. P-N6 BxP; 63. P-B5 BxP; 64. KxP K-N7 and White is forced to give up his Bishop for the RP) 60...P-Q5+! 61. PxP K-N6; 62. B-R3 KxP; 63. K-Q3 KxP; 64. K-K4 P-R5; 65. K-B3 B-Q4+ and White resigned.
