

Hampshire Finish in Fine Style

HAMPSHIRE finished the season's fixture list with a very satisfactory performance against Buckinghamshire. The score in the S.C.C.U. match stands at 9½ to 5½ in Hampshire's favour, and the score over the whole 50 boards in the Amboyna Shield contest is 23½—20½, with six for adjudication.

It is practically certain therefore that Hampshire will comfortably win both matches. The local clubs were again well represented, twelve players collecting seven points, with one game unfinished. Particularly commendable was the performance of our four Juniors on Boards 6, 18, 20 and 32.

This week we have a position from which to play a three-mover.

Technical High had the honour of being the first school team to beat St. John's this season. The result of this match rests on the admission of an unoffended draw between C. Moore (St. John's) and G. E. Aranda (Technical High).

As so happens that the League Adjudicators found the position most interesting, and it was therefore thought to be well worth publishing.

The Adjudicators' remarks were as follows:

"An excellent example of the power of two Rooks on the seventh rank. The position is a variation of the famous pawns and Black wins, the point being that Black can not only gain material but can also protect his own KB2 square by White on Black's seventh rank."

The Adjudicator gave at the same time a considerable amount of detailed analysis, showing how each bit of work is set for themselves.
